

Minutes of the 12th Meeting of the State Executive Committee held on 29th August 2013 at 11:00 A.M. in the Conference Room of the Chief Secretary's Office

The Chief Secretary, Assam chaired the meeting. The Chief Secretary welcomed all the Members and took up the agenda for discussion.

Agenda Item No 1: Confirmation of the Minutes of the 10th & 11th Meetings of the State Executive Committee

Resolution: The State Executive Committee confirmed the minutes of the 10th & 11th meetings of the State Executive Committee held on 3rd May and 7th June 2013 respectively.

Agenda Item No 2: Review of the action taken on the decisions of the 10th Meeting of the State Executive Committee.

Resolution: The State Executive Committee noted the Action Taken Report placed in the meeting. The Committee further directed to follow up on the following decisions of the previous meeting pending for compliance.

Development of a full-fledged State Disaster Response Force Training Centre.</p> <p>As per decision of SEC, Home Department had forwarded a copy of the Request for proposal (RFP) prepared by the Director General of Civil Defence & Home Guards for developing the existing Central Training Institute(CTI), Panikhaiti into a full-fledged SDRF Training Centre to ASDMA. ASDMA had gone through the RFP and provided necessary feedback for incorporation into the RFP document.</p> <p>Civil Defence & Home Guards informed SEC in the 12th meeting that the RFP document is being revised and will be finalised after obtaining the views of Shri G.S. Saini, Director, National Civil Defence College (NCDC), Nagpur. A letter of invite is being sent to Shri Saini who will be visiting Guwahati in this regard.</p>	<p>A. SEC took note of the matter and directed Civil Defence & Home Guards to consult Shri G.S. Saini, Director, National Civil Defence College (NCDC), Nagpur at the earliest and ensure floating of the RFP by 30th September 2013.</p> <p>SEC also directed Addl DG of Civil Defence and Home Guards to coordinate with the Addl. DGP cum Director, Fire and Emergency Services and visit the NCDC and NDRF Training Centre jointly for a better understanding about the facilities, infrastructure required for training of Response Forces so that necessary steps may be taken while developing CTI into a full- fledged State Disaster Response Force Training Centre.</p>

<p>B. Raising of 3rd Company of SDRF Addl. DGP and Director, Fire & Emergency Services, Assam informed SEC that at present there were two companies of SDRF and a proposal has been moved to the Home Department for raising of the 3rd Company. The matter is pending with Home Department.</p> <p>C. Merging of the Command & control of Fire Services and Civil Defence & Home Guards Addl. DGP and Director, Fire & Emergency Services, Assam suggested that since both CD&HG and F&ES have the core responsibility of dealing with emergencies (Rescue of victims) it would be advisable that for effective command and control, both the organizations should be merged under one Head.</p>	<p>B. The Chief Secretary and Chairperson, SEC directed the representative of Home Department to apprise him on the status of the proposal for raising of the 3rd Company of the SDRF within the next two days.</p> <p>C. Safety audit of high rise buildings: GMDA was to undertake Safety Audit of 324 G+4 and above Multi storied buildings in Guwahati city and complete the same within six months i.e. July 2013. GMDA informed SEC that in the last six months safety audit of 289 multi -storied buildings have been completed and requested for additional two months' time for completing the remaining 35 buildings</p> <p>2. Safety audit of water treatment plants: GMC informed SEC that Assam Engineering College has submitted a Techno- financial proposal to GMC amounting to Rs. 40.00 lakh for carrying out the technical safety audit of the GMC water supply works. GMC also informed SEC that this fund would be required from the Government for carrying out this exercise.</p>	<p>1. SEC directed GMDA to complete the safety audit of the balance 35 buildings within a month i.e. by 30th September 2013. SEC further directed GMDA to submit the status note on the already completed safety audit of 289 buildings to ASDMA within a week.</p> <p>2. SEC directed GDD to examine whether the fund amounting to Rs. 40.00 lakh would be adequate to complete the exercise and arrange to provide the required fund to GMC by placing a Supplementary Demand proposal, if necessary.</p>

3. Occupancy Certificates

Regarding **Occupancy certificate**, GMDA in the 10th meeting of SEC informed that Occupancy Certificates have been issued to 40 buildings and notices have been issued for 60 buildings for producing compliance certificate.

Similarly GMC informed SEC that notices have been issued to 764 buildings / builders to produce Occupancy Certificates. GMC also informed SEC that it does not have sufficient man power to complete the exercise within a stipulated time.

SEC therefore, directed GMC to adopt alternative strategy for completing the task early since the matter is of serious concern.

GMDA /GMC informed SEC that not much progress has been made in this regard.

4. Jagabandhu Apartments

Regarding clearance certificate for Jagabandhu apartments, GMC had earlier informed that they were awaiting comments from AEC on the report submitted by Environmental Research & Evaluation Centre (EREC).

However, from the comments of AEC, it appeared that the report was not conclusive enough for issuance of a clearance certificate to Jagabandhu Apartments.

3) SEC took note of the issue and directed GMDA / GMC to :

i) Develop a system of identifying the stages during construction when inspection would be required.

ii) Maintain a log for recording the observations during each of the stages,
iii) Issue of Occupancy Certificates should be based on such checks and clearances.

GMDA/GDD was directed to frame such checklist for issue of Occupancy certificates.

Further to overcome the shortage of manpower for conducting such inspections, SEC suggested that GMDA/GMC may have a list of empanelled

surveyors/engineers/architects who may be given the work on payment basis. SEC further suggested that GMDA/GMC may also explore the possibility of realising these fees from the builders/owners of the buildings themselves.

4) SEC took serious note of the long delay in the matter and directed GMC to:-

i) Inform Chairperson SEC as to why retrofitting of two pillars was recommended and what action has been taken against the substandard work

ii) Set up a committee within seven days with PWD (B)/IITG/AEC to decide as to what more needs to be done for the safety of the building. The report is to be submitted within three weeks to Chairperson SEC

iii) Engage a competent Engineering consultant from Delhi to assess the safety of the Jagabandhu Apartment and submit report within two months positively, so that the matter can be closed.

School Safety: Education Department

1. School Safety Plans

Resolution: SEC directed Education Department to send the copy of the draft amendment of the Non-Government Educational Institution Act 2006 and the Venture Schools and Provincialisation Act within a week to ASDMA for review and suggestions for making Preparation of School DM Plans and conduct of Mock drills mandatory.

2. Change of use of residential building to Schools and noncompliance of safety norms

Resolution: SEC directed GMDA/GMC (depending on the NOC issuing authority) to:

- a) Issue notices to these 66 schools which have changed use of residential buildings to schools to relocate, giving sufficient time for necessary action by the schools. If no action is taken by the school authorities within the stipulated time, then action is to be initiated as per law which may also include closure.
- b) Assess the actual safety status of these schools and if they do not meet the norms of building bye laws in force, action as per law is to be initiated as under no circumstances the safety of a child can be compromised. If, on the other hand, these schools are found safe according to necessary Act / Laws and Norms, such schools may be regularized

3. Non-compliance of Safety Norms by Schools


