**Resolution:** The State Executive Committee noted the Action Taken Report placed in the meeting. The Committee further directed to follow up on the following decisions of the previous meeting pending for compliance.

A. GMDA informed that 133 apartments out of the list of 400 have been identified for conducting RVS during the current year.

**SEC directed GMDA to share the list of identified apartment list with ASDMA.**

**B. Vulnerable block in SBI residential colony, Bhangaghar.**

B. Regarding vulnerable block in SBI residential colony, Bhangaghar, GMC informed that they have testified that the building is safe.

**SEC directed GMC to get the opinion of PWD building with regard to its safety.**

**C. Safety audit of water treatment plants:**

C. GMC has given the “go-ahead” to Assam Engineering College to start the safety audit of the water supply works of GMC.

**Chairperson SEC however, advised GMC to go beyond structural safety of the Water Treatment Plants and to look into aspects of probable tampering of the water sources as well.**

**D. Occupancy Certificates**

D. GMDA informed that a system for inspection of buildings at various stages of construction has been developed and the same has also been incorporated in the new Building Bye-Laws.

**E. Jagabandhu Apartments**

E. GMC informed that while AEC has given its clearance, IIT(G) has suggested for incorporation of certain measures before giving the clearance certificate.

GMC was directed to ensure compliance of the same and submit clearance certificate for closure of the

**Agenda Item No 6: Training Calendar 2014-15**

SEC further directed ASDMA to create special infrastructure in terms of manpower and equipments in Dima Hasao, Karbi Anglong, Chirang, Kokrajhar, Baksa and Udalguri at DDMA level in view of the vulnerability of these six districts.


