

Minutes of the 20th meeting of State executive Committee (SEC) of Assam State Disaster management Authority (ASDMA) held on 12th May 2015 in the conference hall of the Chief Secretary, Government of Assam.

Shri Jitesh Khosla, Chief Secretary and the Chairperson of SEC chaired the meeting.

3. **Agenda Item: 1. Approval of Annual Work Plan of ASDMA for 2015-16.**

3.1 Shri P. K. Tiwari, Chief executive officer of ASDMA underscored following points while sharing the Annual Work plan of ASDMA for the year 2015-16:

1. The Annual Work Plan has not been prepared for the entire available amount for the year 2015-16, but focus is on utilizing the savings from the fund received under 13th Finance Commission and State Plan and Non-plan fund.
2. Capacity-building of departmental officials on preparation of Disaster management Plan and creating robust institutional framework for meaningful and vibrant citizen engagement have been addressed in a significant way.
3. Knowledge management and knowledge transfer are key to preparedness to cope with disasters. Use of IT and GIS for knowledge management and transfer have been given considerable importance.
4. Availability of critical equipments with SDRF and other government agencies responsible for relief and response operations is extremely importance. This has, therefore, been one of the key areas of the AWP.
5. Relevant research in the area of disaster management is equally important. Research Studies have, therefore, been incorporated in the AWP, aimed at enriching the preparedness level of Government departments.

3 SEC approved the Annual Work Plan of ASDMA for 2015-16 as enclosed at **Annexure-II** with the following Component-wise break –up of estimated fund involvement:

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4. While approving the AWP following observations were made:
1. Chairperson exhorted all the Head of Departments to approach the task of preparation of Disaster management plans with a sense of purpose and urgency, and reiterated the need to nominate a senior officer of the department/directorate as the Nodal Person.
 2. He further highlighted the need to develop SOPs for the critical functional areas by each and every department.
 3. There was unanimity that municipal bodies need to prepare contingency plans with perfect clarity on the role and responsibilities of each of the agencies.
 4. Suggestion was made that ASDMA need not go into the mapping and DPR preparation for the developments of the wetlands at this stage.
 5. It was also suggested that the scope of work for the study on zoning regulations, building bye-laws etc. should have focus on practical issues involved in preventing or mitigating disasters.
 6. Chairperson suggested that the ASDMA should chalk out a comprehensive action plan for the dissemination of the Information Capsules on Disaster management issues.
 7. Another important suggestion was to build a common database of the equipments available with various agencies for their optimum utilisation.
 8. It was further suggested that the equipments provided to SDRF should be deployed strategically rather than keeping them at one place.
 9. The Committee also asked ASDMA to prepare a SOP for the maintenance of the assets and equipments.
 10. Chairperson observed that preparation of Village master Plan for Disaster Management by involving Village Land management and Conservation Committees is a good idea and the work already undertaken by FREMA in this field will be of help.

Agenda: 2 Availability of Fund

SEC took note of the fund availability status of ASDMA as placed at **Annexure-III**.

Agenda: 3. Procurement of Equipments for emergency response by utilizing the 10% of the annual allocation of the State Disaster Response Fund 2015-16.

SEC approved the list of equipments to be procured as placed at **Annexure – IV & IV-A**, and directed that the equipments proposed for procurement for other departments should be procured by the respective departments by following due procedure and ASDMA should necessarily have a representative in the the Purchase Committees of those Departments.

Agenda 4: Setting up of HF/VHF wireless network for Disaster Management purpose in Assam

SEC approved the proposal for setting up of HF/VHF wireless network for Disaster Management purpose in Assam and gave the following directions:

- The Assam Police (Communication) shall take responsibility of procuring, installing and managing the HF/VHF Network.
- ASDMA shall provide necessary financial assistance for the procurement of HF/VHF sets
- The Assam Police (Communication) shall arrange additional manpower, if required for managing the newly procured HF/VHF sets.
- The Assam Police (Communication) and ASDMA shall jointly develop the Standard Operating Protocol for use of HF/VHF during periods of disaster/crisis.
- Assam Police (Communication) shall train a few persons from the D.C and S.D.O(C) Offices to meet the demand of trained personnel during periods of disaster.



Agenda 5: Procurement of 30 nos. Of INMARSAT ISAT phone pro terminals for setting up of failsafe satellite communication for disaster management in Assam

SEC approved the proposal for procurement of 30 nos. of INMARSAT ISAT phone pro terminals from TCIL amounting to Rs. 20,88,991/- only under the 10% of annual allocation for State Disaster Response Fund 2015-16.




