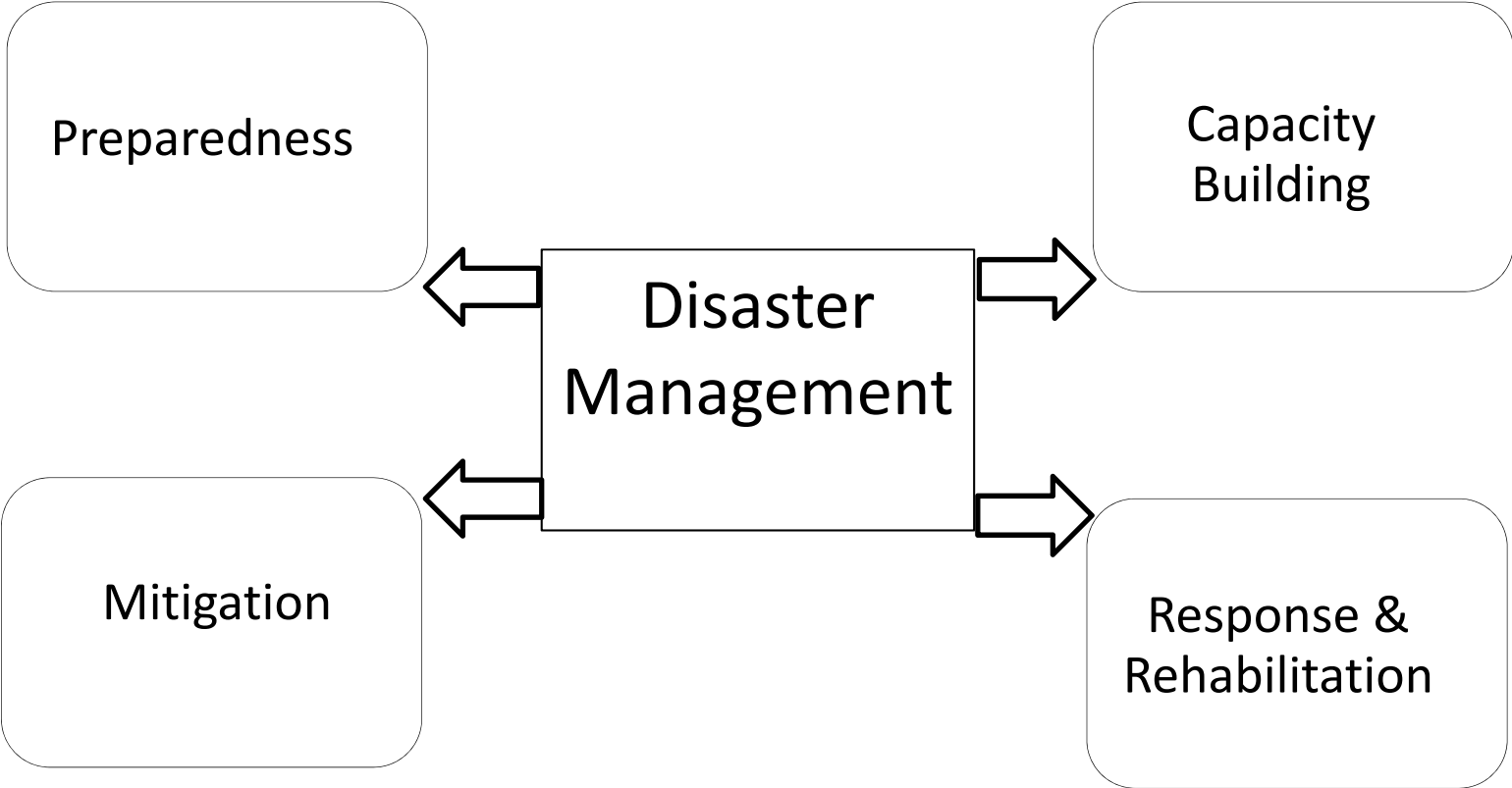

- Ex-Gratia payment to families of deceased persons - 4.00 lakh
- Loss of a limb or eye(s)-
 - a) 59,100/- disability 40% - 60%
 - b) 2.00 lakh- more than 60%
- Grievous injury requiring hospitalization-
 - a) 12,700/- more than a week
 - b) 4,300/- less than a week

SDRF Norms of Assistance

- Clothing- 1,800/-
- Utensils/household goods- 2,000/-
- GR for families whose livelihood is seriously affected (not housed in relief camps)-
 - a) 60/- per adult
 - b) 45/- per child
- GR as per norms of [DM Manual 2015](#)

Agriculture

Upto 2 Ha of landholding:

- De-silting /Removal of debris/restoration - 12,200/-
- Loss of land by landslide, avalanche, change of course of rivers- 37,500/- (small and marginal farmers)
- Input subsidy (crop loss is more than 33%)
 - a) 6,800/- in rainfed areas and 13,500/- in assured irrigated areas
 - b) Perennial crops- 18,000/-
 - c) Sericulture- 4,800/-, for Eri, Mulberry, Tussar
 - d) 6,000/- for Muga

Agriculture contd..

Input subsidy to farmers having more than 2 ha. of landholding:

- 6,800/- in rainfed areas and restricted to sown areas

Animal Husbandry

Fishery, Handicrafts/Handloom

Fishery Department:

- Assistance to Fisherman for repair / replacement of boats, nets, damaged or lost Boat, Dugout, Canoe, Catamaran, net-
 - a) 4,100/- for repair of partially damaged boats only
 - b) 2,100/- for repair of partially damaged net
 - c) 9,600/- for replacement of fully damaged boats
 - d) 2,600/- for replacement of fully damaged net
- Input subsidy for fish seed farm: 8,200/-

Handicrafts/Handloom – Assistance To Artisans:

- Replacement of damaged tools/ equipment- 4,100/-
- Loss of raw material/goods in process/finished goods- 4,100/-

Housing

- Fully/Severely damaged/ destroyed houses (Pucca/ Kutcha):
 - a) 95,100/- (plain areas)
 - b) 1,01,900/- (hilly areas)
- Partially Damaged Houses:
 - a) Pucca - 5,200/-
 - b) Kutcha- 3,200/-
- Huts - 4,100/-
- Cattle shed attached with house - 2,100/-

Repair/restoration (immediate nature) of damaged infrastructure:

- Roads & bridges
- Drinking Water Supply Works- 1.5 Lakhs per unit
- Irrigation (major not covered, minor- 1.5 Lakhs per schemes
- Schools (only primary & secondary) - 1.5 Lakhs per structure

Repair/restoration (immediate nature) of damaged infrastructure:

- Primary Health Centers -1.5 Lakhs per structure
- Community assets owned by Panchayat- 2 lakhs
- Revenue generating sectors such as Telecommunication and Power (except immediate restoration of power supply) excluded

New addition in GR:

- Sanitary Napkins
- Baby Foods for above 2 years

Timely assessment of loss and damages

- Enough flexibility to offer **all enlisted** relief measures by DCs
- Timely and barrier free disbursement of all admissible assistance
- [Circle level Task Force](#) for damage assessment and RG and other SDRF proposals
- All approvals at DC level except major repairing and restorations
- All SDRF projects must be completed by 31st March every year otherwise project will be foreclosed
- **Sanction of RG within 30 days** from disaster

Delegation of powers to the Deputy Commissioners

- Financial Power has been delegated to the Deputy Commissioner to issue sanction against admissible assistance under SDRF for Agriculture, A.H. & Vety., Fishery, Sericulture etc. and Minor repairing of infrastructures

Road Ahead

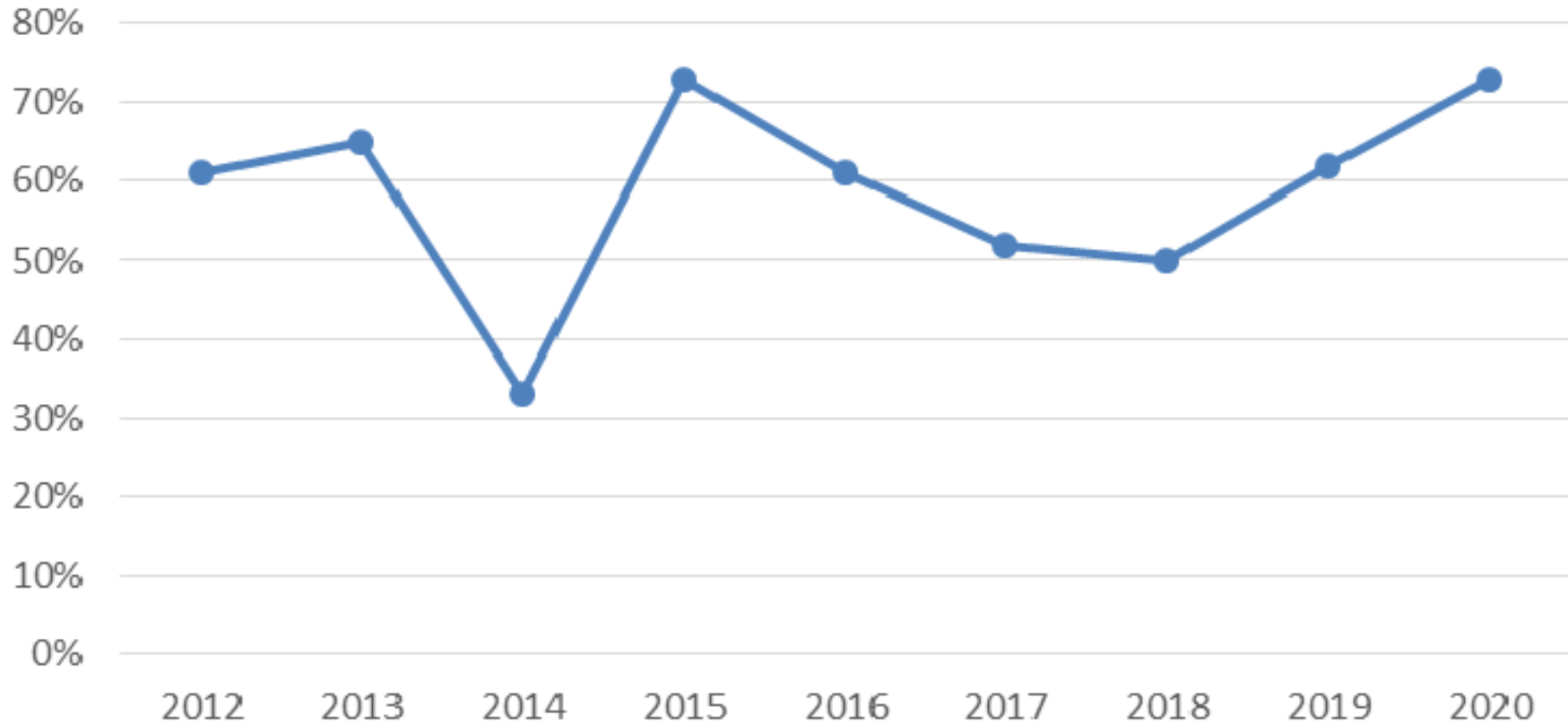

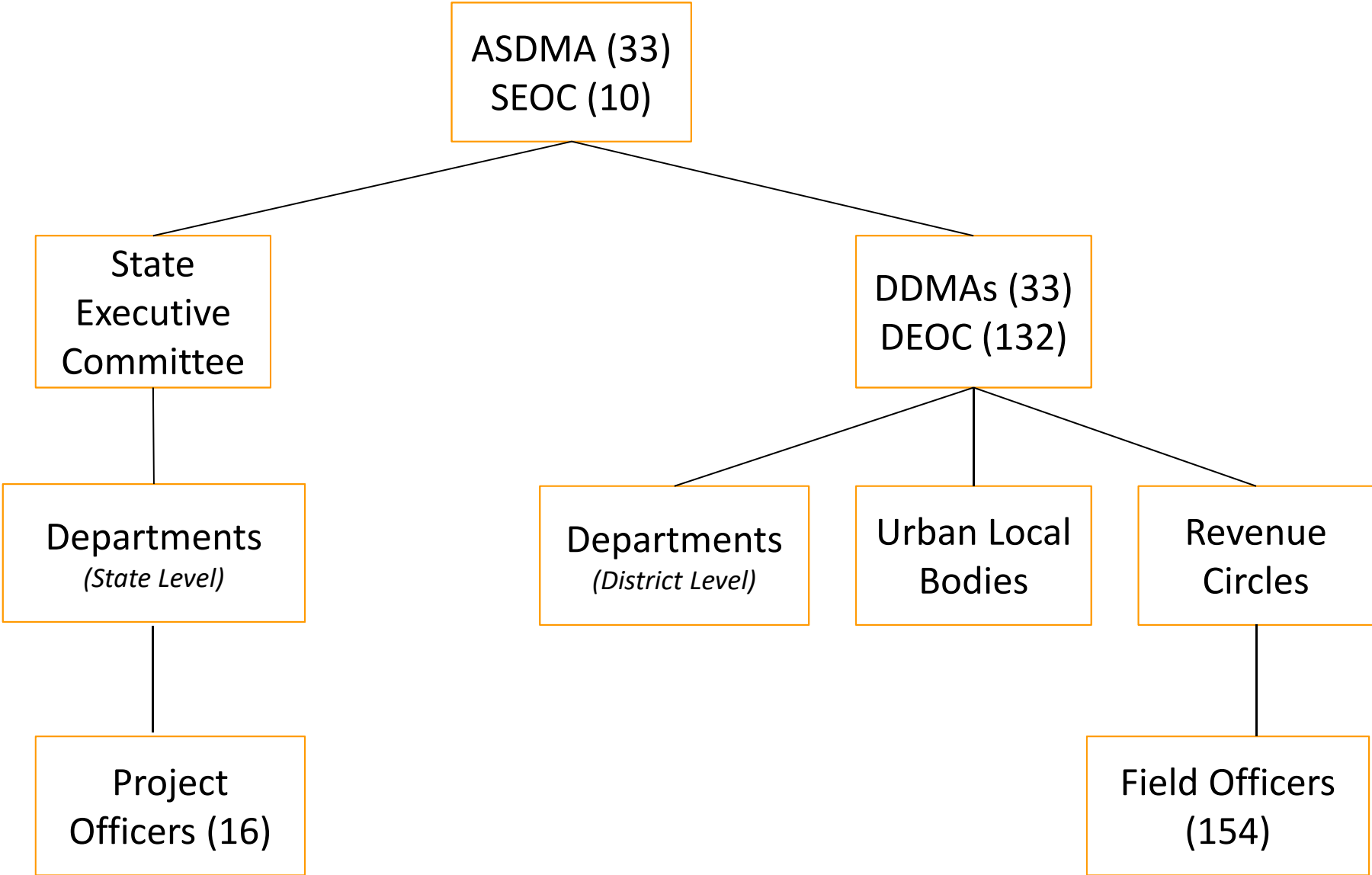
Efficacy of Flood Early Warning System

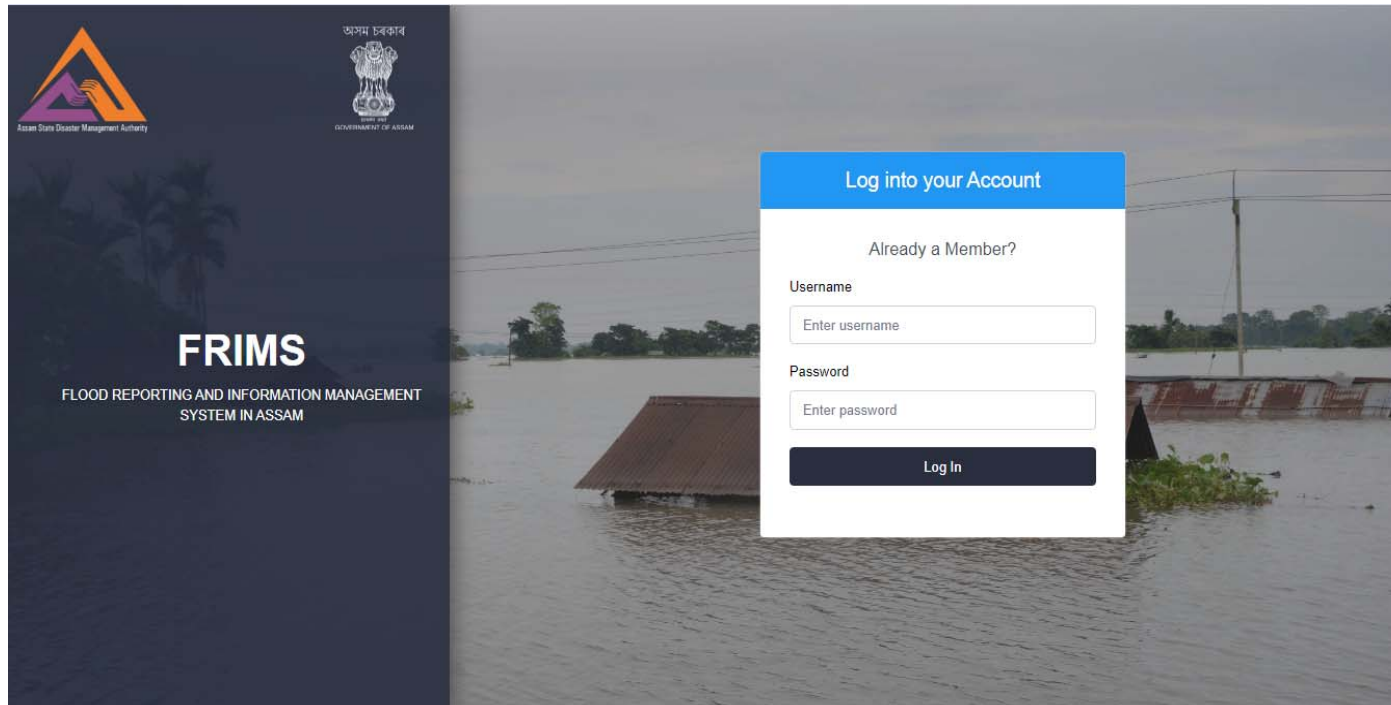

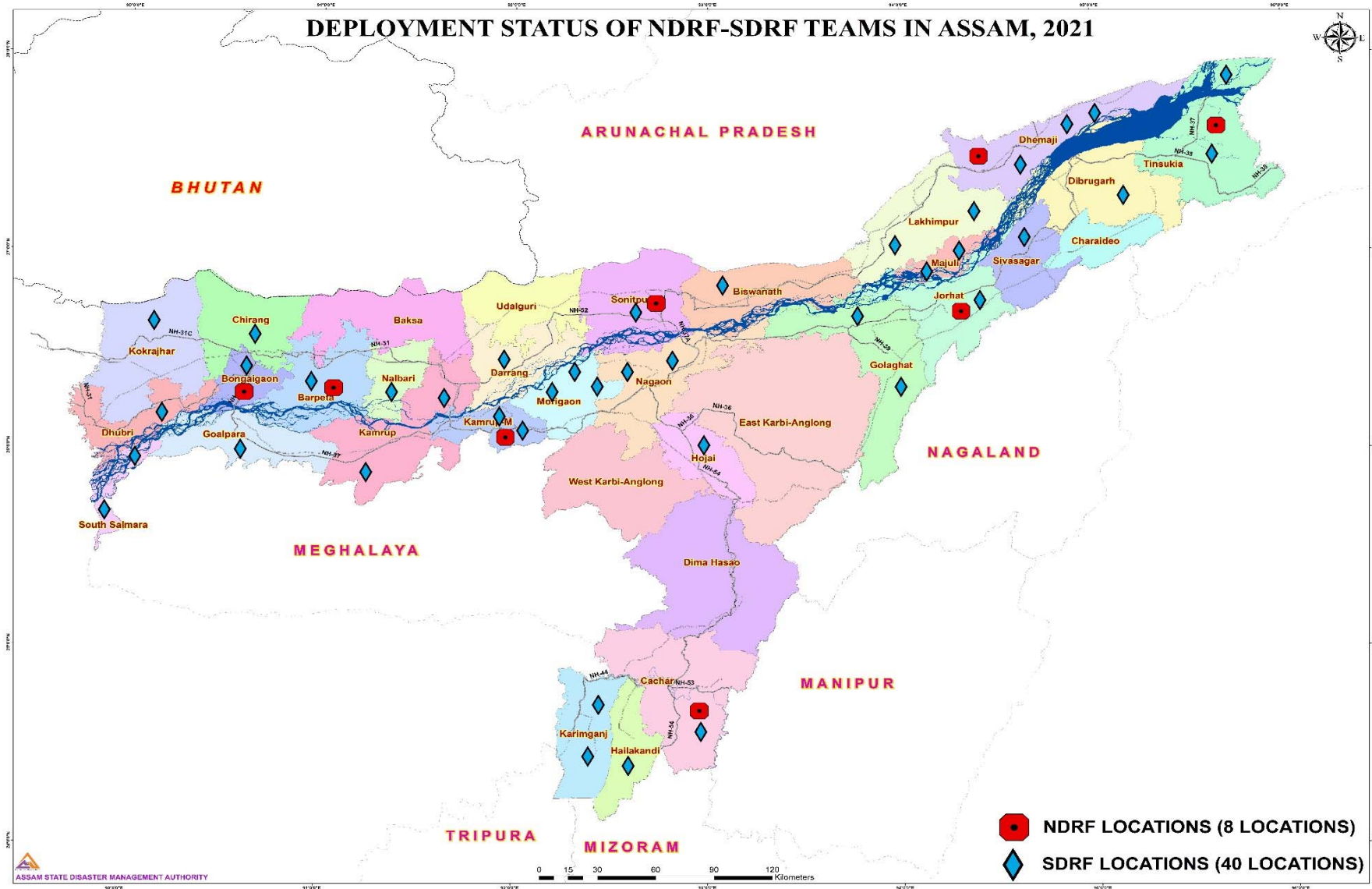

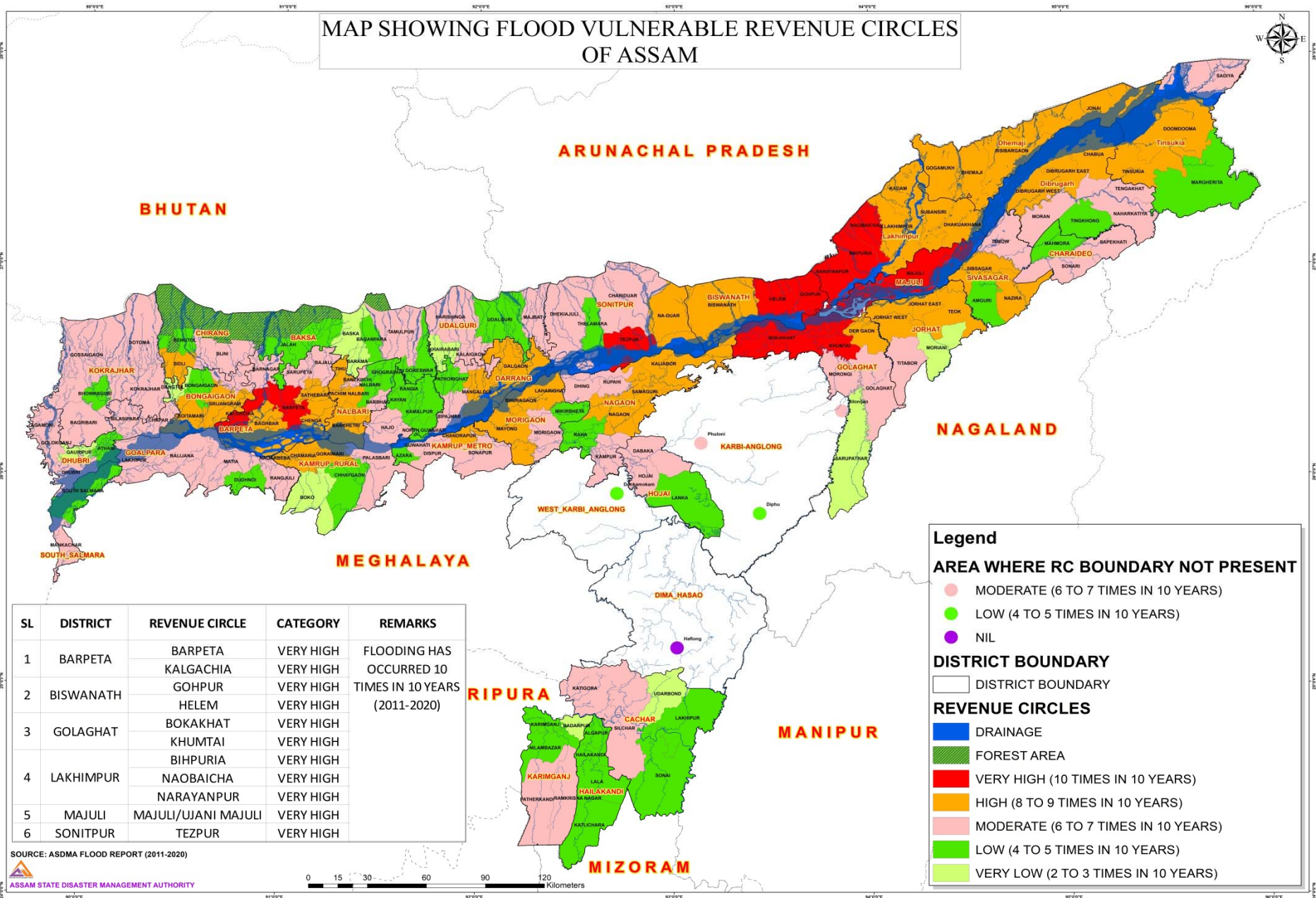

INDIA –CHINA COOPERATION

- Expert Level Mechanism (ELM) between India and China to discuss interaction and co-operation upon provision of hydrological data in flood season, emergency management and other issues regarding trans-border rivers as agreed between them.
- The three Chinese hydrological stations i.e. Nugesha, Yangcum and Nuxia lying on the mainstream of the Yarlung Zangbu River, which will provide hydrological information in flood season to India.
- Hydrological Information of above mentioned stations will be provided to India within 30 minutes after 8:00 hrs and 20:00 hrs in Beijing time (05:30 hrs and 17:30 hrs in IST) every day from May 15 – October 15 every year

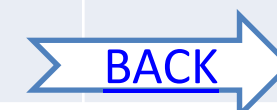


The Task Force in coordination with the concerned line departments shall prepare and submit proposals for Rehabilitation Grant against storm/flood/cyclone/fire/lighting/erosion/landslide as per the SDRF norms expeditiously.

Further, the Task Force shall also prepare list of beneficiaries for admissible assistance under SDRF norms for agriculture, Animal Husbandry, Handicraft/Handloom/Housing/Fishery/Sericulture and proposals for immediate restoration of damaged minor infrastructures like Primary School, Primary Health Centre, electric poles,

wires, Panchayat Ghar, Anganwadi Centre etc. and submit the same to the District Disaster Management Authority (DDMA).

All the aforementioned proposals shall submit not later than 15 days of the occurrence of the disaster to the District Disaster Management Authority (DDMA).

The Task Force in co-ordination with the concerned line departments shall prepare and submit proposals for Rehabilitation Grant against storm/flood/cyclone/fire/lighting/erosion.

NOTIFICATION

No. RGR (RRR) 521/2019/3, Dated Dispur, the 11th August, 2021

In continuation of the notification No. RGR (RRR) 521/2019/1 dated 26th May, 2021, the roles and responsibilities of the Revenue Circle Level Task Force are notified as follows:

- The Task Force will ensure post disaster damage assessment for extending assistance admissible under the heads of Housing, Agriculture, Animal Husbandry, Handicraft, Handloom, Fishery and Sericulture of SDRF norms.
- Proposals shall be prepared expeditiously after joint assessment by *Lot Mondal, Gaonburah* and elected PRI/ULB representatives. The Task Force, after finalizing the proposals, will submit along with land status, bank details of the beneficiaries, extent of damage, types of houses to the District Disaster Management Authority (DDMA) along with its minutes for approval.
- While preparing Rehabilitation Grant proposals for houses damaged, the committee will prepare separate lists for affected families residing over allotted land and also for those families living on Government land who are otherwise eligible for allotment/settlement of land as per current land policy of the State.
- While preparing the proposals in respect of Agriculture, Animal Husbandry, Handicraft, Handloom, Fishery and Sericulture, the circle level functionaries of jurisdictional departments will prepare the list of beneficiaries in coordination with *Lot Mondal, Gaonburah* and elected PRI/ULB representatives.
- All the aforementioned proposals shall be submitted as per SDRF norms not later than 15 days of the occurrence of the disaster to the District Disaster Management Authority (DDMA).
- The Task Force shall also ensure preparation of proposals for immediate restoration of damaged minor infrastructures like Primary School, Primary Health Centre, electric poles, wires, *panchayatghar, anganwadi* centre etc. as admissible under SDRF by the circle level functionaries of the concerned departments and submit the same to the District Disaster Management Authority (DDMA) through the district level head of the concerned line departments.
- Since new work is not allowed under SDRF norms, the Task Force will ensure that the proposals are made for immediate restoration of damaged properties only within 30 days of occurrence of disaster. Claims pertaining to old damages will not be entertained by the Task Force.
- All proposals other than RG should be submitted to the DDMA through the district level head of the concerned line departments after approval of the Task Force. District level head of the concerned line departments will submit a non-duplicity certificate along with the proposals that the immediate repairing/restoration work is not undertaken under any other scheme.

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
- A template for submission of SDRF proposals by various line departments has been approved by the SEC in its 20th Meeting and the same has been incorporated as appendix IX of Assam Disaster Management Manual 2015 which should be used invariably.
- Quorum for the Task Force meeting shall be two third of the members with mandatory presence of the chairperson. Meetings of the Task Force will be convened twice a month during notified flood season. However, in case of any non-recurrent disaster, the Task Force shall meet within 1 week of the occurrence.

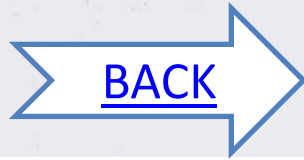
